Mayor Joseph Svingala led in the pledge to the flag. A moment of silence was held for Bruce Kuhl, Mike Sheppard, and Mike and Ellinda White.

Town Clerk Andrea read the Correspondence list.

<u>Minutes of Council Meeting</u>: Councilwoman Evans motioned to approve meeting minutes 09/14/2021 and Meeting minutes 09/21/2021. Dr. Warren 2nd the motion. The Vote was unanimous.

<u>Unfinished Business</u>: Treasurer Kelly Krupski gave a review of the financials. No questions were asked about financials.

New Business

Clerk Almeida explained the options that were given for cell phones for the office. Councilwoman Mead made a motion to approve to purchase of two I-phone 11's and two I-phone Se's for the Town. Councilwoman Evans 2nd the motion. A discussion was had about accessories and insurance for the phones. The Clerk will research the best options available. The Vote was unanimous in purchasing the phones.

The Council reviewed a quote for Safe Touch for the Town Hall. The cost of the system is: NVR system with four cameras, one keypad, one motion detector, and three wireless contacts (for three doors). Installation \$ 995 and \$ 54.95 monthly It was decided that the Council will review later after looking into all the options available.

A discussion about the drainage issues on Perry Street and Middleton: maintenance Supervisor Bruce suggested what he believed would be needed to get the ditches cleaned out so that the water would flow properly. Councilman Eckels spoke on his concerns about the drainage issue. Town Attorney Craig Sherar explained the purpose of the Easement paperwork and that it is a standard legal document. Bruce explained the area that he would need would strictly be for the cleaning of the ditches only. Councilman Eckels made a motion to allow Bruce to place marking flags in the areas included in the



easement, with Councilman Eckels assisting with homeowners. Councilwoman Evans 2nd the motion. The Vote passed unanimously. It was discussed that Councilman Eckels would dismiss himself from any decisions on the drainage issue moving forward.

Councilwoman Evans made a motion to approve the Ordinance 2021-10. 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ORDINANCE 2013-3

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF POMONA PARK, FLORIDA, GRANTING ADDITIONAL HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION FOR LOW INCOME SENIORS, REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH, PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the voters of the State of Florida have passed Amendment 11 – Additional Homestead Exemption for Low Income Seniors; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council has determined they desire to grant an additional exemption allowed by Amendment 11,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF POMONA PARK: Section 1.

Chapter 46 of the Town of Pomona Park Code of Ordinances is amended as follows. Add section 46-25, which shall read as follows:

An additional exemption is granted from ad valorem real property taxes in an amount equal to the assessed value of the property where: a) the property is the owners homestead, b) the just value of the property is less than \$250,000, c) the owner has maintained permanent residence on the property for not less than 25 years, d) the owners are 65 years old or older and, e) the household income does not exceed the household income limitation set out in Florida Statute § 196.075.

This exemption only applies to taxes levied by the Town of Pomona Park.

The taxpayer must claim the exemption annually. The application shall be submitted to the property appraiser of Putnam County by March 1st of each year.

Pursuant to amendment 11, a supermajority is required for passage

Section 2. Severability

Each phrase, sentence, paragraph, section or other provision of this Ordinance is severable from all other such phrases, sentences, paragraphs, sections and provisions. Should any phrase, sentence, paragraph, section or provision of this Ordinance be declared by the courts to be unconstitutional or invalid, such declaration shall not affect any other portion or provision of this Ordinance.

Section 3. Conflicts

All ordinances or resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are hereby superceded or repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 4. Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage as provided by law and shall apply to the ad valorem taxes from January 1, 2014, and thereafter.

Re: Keeping of horses

I have been asked by Linda about whether or not horses can be kept on a 4 acre residentially zoned property. Pets are a normal residential activity. There is nothing in the Town's code that defines what pets can or cannot be kept on a residentially zoned property. There are ordinances that deal specifically with cats and dogs and some general discussions about nuisances created by the keeping of animals.

It is my opinion that so long as the animals are only being kept as pets, and not for any commercial purpose, there is no prohibition on the type of animal that can be kept in a residential area. Thus, so long as there is no boarding of other people's horses, or the horses are not being used for a commercial purpose, there is no problem.

This opinion does not in any way absolve the owner of the responsibility to properly keep and care for the horses. The horses, as with any animal, cannot be a nuisance to neighbors. For example, they cannot reach over the property boundaries and eat the neighbor's trees or bushes.
