**4) Any person who becomes disorderly or who fails to confine his or her comments to the identified subject or business, shall be cautioned by the Mayor and thereafter must conclude his or her remarks on the subject within the remaining designated time limit.**

**Any speaker failing to comply, as cautioned, shall be barred from making any additional comments during the meeting and may be removed, as necessary, for the remainder of the meeting.**

Discussion included postponement of crosswalk conversations, the possibility of bait vehicles to slow traffic, surplus school district vehicles potentially being purchased and painted, speeding concerns from a resident, possible speed bumps on Pleasant Street, replacement of town signage, issues with Flock cameras, and lighting discussions.
